#### **Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports:**

Mayor Nix called on Council Member King for Public Health & Safety: Council Member King called on Chief Littleton for the Police Department report. He reported there were 87 Total Reports for November 2022 and 794 Total Reports Year to Date. See Appendix 1.

Council Member King called on Chief Davis for the Fire Department Report. Chief Davis reported there were 61 Total Calls for the first half of November. See Appendix 2.

Savannah reported the December calendar is out. She reported on the programs that are coming up in December such as Cookies with Mrs. Claus; Letters to Santa; Ornament Decorating, Craft Kits. Courtney reported the judging for the Window Decorating Contest would be at 4pm Wednesday before the Tree Lighting on December 1<sup>st</sup>.
