Work Session called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Nix.

Proclamation Honoring Reverend Dr. Albert L. Jones

Whereas, Reverend Dr. Albert L. Jones began his legacy on November 9, 1938, born in Wilton, Alabama; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones joined the U.S. Army National Guard and U.S. Army and was honorably discharged in 1965; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones became one of the first African American Police Deputies for the City of Montevallo during the height of the civil rights movement; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones accepted his calling and was ordained into the ministry where he served the Lord, preaching and teaching the gospel of Jesus Christ in 1970; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones served as Senior Pastor for Mountain Baptist Church in Calera, Alabama for five years; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones served as Senior Pastor for Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Wilton, Alabama for nearly 47 years; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones received a Bachelor of Theology Degree from Birmingham Baptist Bible College, Master of Theology and Doctorate of Divinity from the Tennessee School of Religion; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones received a Doctorate of Humanities from the Tuskegee Extension of the Tennessee School of Religion; and

Whereas, Reverend Jones served as Dean and Instructor of the Tennessee Theological School of Religion for 23 years; served as President of the Advisory Board of the Birmingham Estonian Baptist Bible College; the University of Montevallo Extension for 10 years; served as a Worthy Patron of Masonic of Prince Hall; Moderator for the Lillie Star District Centerville, Alabama for 30 years; and served as the head Chaplain of the Shelby Brookwood Medical Center for 27 years.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rusty Nix, as Mayor of the City of Montevallo, Alabama, do hereby recognize and honor Reverend Dr. Albert L. Jones, for a lifetime of dedicated service, on this day, May 23, 2022.

CITY OF MONTEVALLO ORDINANCE NO. 05232022-701

An Ordinance Rezoning Certain Property From R2 to Special District

WHEREAS, certain property located within the limits of the City of Montevallo, Alabama, at 270 Gardner Street is currently owned by Dian Lawler Johnson & James Goree Johnson, III 6/ Enterprises Trust 4/12 Int L. A. Holding; and,

WHEREAS, after holding a public hearing on the matter, the Montevallo Planning Commission has recommended that, at the request of John Parker and Michelle Donovan, on behalf of the property owners, this parcel be rezoned from the R2 to Special District, subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Montevallo City Council has held a public hearing on the Planning Commission's recommendation and carefully considered the said recommendation and the comments thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEVALLO, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the zoning district boundaries be amended so as to rezone the following property from R2 to Special District, and that such rezoning be reflected on the Zoning Map of the City of Montevallo:

[See Attached Exhibit A]

Provided, however, that such rezoning is subject to the following conditions:

- A. A fully engineered site development plan that complies with the approved Special District layout plan, Sections 18.01.b.4 and 25.05 of the Montevallo Zoning Ordinance.
- B. The site development plan include appropriate screening fencing and lighting in character with the surrounding residential structures.
- C. The existing building may be used for an office and no more than 30 recreational vehicles may be parked on site.
- D. Any changes to the approved Site Development Plan or permitted uses in the established Special District requires Planning Commission and City Council approval.

Section 2. That the City Clerk is directed to file a copy of this ordinance, including a description of the property in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, and to advertise this ordinance as provided by law.

This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and advertisement as provided by law.

An Ordinance Rezoning Certain Property From R2 - Special District to the Agricultural - Residential District

WHEREAS, certain property located within the limits of the City of Montevallo, Alabama, Parcel ID Number 58.27.1.11.1.001.001.000 and is currently owned by Daniel Sealy and Courtney Sealy and

WHEREAS, after holding a public hearing on the matter, the Montevallo Planning Commission has recommended that, at the request of the property owner, this parcel be rezoned from the R2 Special District to the Agricultural - Residential District, subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Montevallo City Council has held a public hearing on the Planning Commission's recommendation and carefully considered the said recommendation and the comments thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEVALLO, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the zoning district boundaries be amended so as to rezone the following property from R2 Special District to Agricultural - Residential District, and that such rezoning be reflected on the Zoning Map of the City of Montevallo:
