Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports to Continue:

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Eisenberg for Recreation, Preservation and Community Development. Council Member Eisenberg called on Shane Baugh, Parks and Recreation Director. Shane reported softball, soccer, baseball are all underway; Orr Park Restroom's are under construction; Shane received question from Council about how coaches are chosen; he responded with background check, receive education for coaches; and concussion test.

City Council Meeting: February 26, 2024

Ms. Sarah Hogan, program director provided the following report:

- Grant Application: I and Savannah attended the Notice of Funding Opportunity Webinar on Friday to learn all the details of applying for a Years 6 – 10 grant from the White House with oversight by the CDC. The application packet is due in April and we will be working to compile all the required documents and data for the application packet. Applicants must provide matching non-federal funds equivalent to or greater than the amount of requested federal funds. DFC match requirements include:
 - 100% match for funding years 1 through 6
 - 125% match for funding years 7 and 8
 - 150% match for funding years 9 and 10
 - Opioid Response Strategy Team: I met with the Opioid Response Strategy Team, a partnership with the CDC and DEA and other Alabama Coalition leaders last week. We talked about how to get accurate overdose numbers, and emerging trends, such as the new novel drugs which are currently a combination of substances. We also talked about products that help to properly dispose of prescription meds at home.
 - <u>QPPM</u>: I will be attending a meeting in Montgomery this Thursday with the Office of Prevention for Alabama Department of Mental Health. I look forward to networking with colleagues around the State and bringing back some valuable information.
 - Guest Speaker @ High School: Shelby County Schools is hosting two guest speakers at Montevallo High School, the first was held today with a session beginning at 6:30 Ole Pete Key, the Hope Dealer will be speaking about building character. And next Monday, March 4 at 9:00 or 6:30, Richard Guerry with the Institute for responsible online & cellphone communications will discuss what you need to know about youth's technology usage. These events are free and open to the public.
 - Webinar: Next Tuesday, March 5th at 5:30 pm will be our next partnership webinar titled, Scrolling into Shadows: Unmasking the Dark Side of Social Media Addiction, Trafficking and Mental Health.

ORDINANCE 02262024-287

AN ORDNANCE TO AMMEND SECTION 8- 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MONTEVALLO

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the governing body of the City of Montevallo to set policies and enact regulations which improve the quality of life for everyone who lives, works, or does business in the City and to attract new residents and new and diverse businesses and to become a part of the community; and

WHEREAS, it is an inherent function of the City of Montevallo to facilitate growth and diversification of the City's economic platform through business recruitment, retention, and expansion; and

WHEREAS, the City of Montevallo has experienced a proliferation of certain businesses, including those which are licensed and authorized to operate under Title 5 of the Alabama Code, Chapter 18A Deferred Presentment Services Act and Title 5 of the Alabama Code, Chapter 19A Alabama Pawn Shop Act; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds the development of payday loan, car title loan, check cashing, gold and silver brokers, tattoo parlor, pawn shop, massage parlors, vape shop, tobacco shop, retail package liquor sales, and Cannabidiol (CBD) Product Sales businesses, within the territorial confines of the Montevallo Downtown Urban Core may adversely impact the City's development and effectively limit the ability of the City to attract diverse types of businesses; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Montevallo to not only protect the overall economic development of the City but also to preserve the Downtown Historic District federal designation in the area designated along Main Street from Shelby Street to Oak Street to provide for orderly growth, and balance the development of all businesses in order to have a diverse and stable economy.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Montevallo, Alabama that the City of Montevallo has determined it is in the best interest of the City to amend the Code of Ordinances of the City of Montevallo.

SECTION 8-18 Procedure for Review of new Business License Applications.

I. The following businesses shall be subject to review for approval / denial within the area designated along Main Street from Shelby Street to Oak Street. (Montevallo Downtown Urban Core B2-SD Zoned District)

- a.) Payday Loan Businesses
- b.) Automobile Title Loan Businesses
- c.) Check Cashing Stores

- d.) Gold and Silver Brokers
- e.) Tattoo Parlors
- f.) Pawn Shops
- g.) Vape Shops
- h.) Tobacco Shops
- i.) Retail Package Liquor Sales
- j.) Cannabidiol (CBD) Product Sales
- k.) Regulated Massage Parlors

The City of Montevallo shall review all business license applications submitted from the kinds of businesses listed in (a.) through (k.) above. As part of said reviews, it will conduct a review in which the items described below in (i.) through (iv.) will be considered and comments from the applicant and other interested parties will be heard. The City will also consider any exception requests made related to the requirements, or other items listed below. After completing a review, the City Council will vote on approval of the application. The Montevallo City Council shall make the final decision regarding the granting of applicable business licenses, including but not limited to these specific areas of responsibility by the City:

- Protection of public health, safety, morals and welfare;
- Protection of existing properties, including property use, value and preservation of the Montevallo Historic District designation;
- iii. Traffic and pedestrian safety; and,
- iv. Consistency, compatibility and conformity with the City of Montevallo Comprehensive Plan
- 2. These restrictions shall not apply to any banking or lending institutions that are insured and regulated by agencies of the United States of America or the State of Alabama.
- 3. We Buy Gold and Silver businesses shall be required to comply with the State of Alabama pawn shop regulations.
- 4. These results shall only apply to check cashing businesses where this is the sole or primary purpose for the business rather than an incidental service offered to its customers.
- 5. All current existing businesses shall be "grandfathered" at their existing physical location.

6. This ordinance shall become effective on the day of
