Re: 2019-2020 Fiscal Year Financial Budgets

Council:

The attached draft budget includes the vast majority of requests from all department heads. Among other things, it includes the 3% merit increases, eliminates curbside recycling, adds a Sustainability Coordinator and assistant at the Recycling Center, and increases support for the Golf Course. In addition, it also includes:

- In the General Fund, on the revenue side, you will note that our projected income remains in line with our actual experience this year. (pp. 1-5)
- Our 4 cents of the Sales Tax Revenue is estimated at \$2,715,000. The remaining one cent tax is estimated at \$682,500, with 90% going to MDCD and 10% to the Regions Reserve. (p. 1)
- On the expenditure side, one of the biggest changes in next year's
 projected budget is the 3% merit increase for eligible employees. You
 will note that specific increase reflected in the salary line-item within
 each department.
- Importantly, the budget does not include any anticipated increase in health insurance rates for next year.
- Since 2020 is an election year in the city, this budget includes electionrelated costs. (p. 19)
- The General Fund budget continues our \$10,000 in support for the Tinglewood Festival. (p.22)
- The budget also keeps our other "contributions" at essentially the same level as last year, except for the \$7,000 added to fund our city's delegation to Japan in the fall. (p.23)
- City Hall also includes an increase in costs for the new IT in a Box service.(p.22)
- Salaries and related expenses for Karen Evans and Sandy Byrd have been moved to Court. A part-time bailiff position was also added. (p.78)
- We also increased our support for the Library, as they requested, by \$13,753. (p. 62)
- Curbside Recycling is eliminated. (p. 43)

- Regarding the Golf Course, Dwight Dellinger and the City Clerk met with Erik Mass with the UM athletic Dept. Erick stressed the importance of having a professional grounds keeper that knows about maintaining grass and is licensed to spray chemicals. Those changes, together with recommendations from Dwight, added around \$110,000 to golf expenditures. (pp.47-48) Dwight also has a plan for increasing play / revenue at the course. That resulted in an increase in projected revenue of approximately \$54,000. (p. 4)
- Park & Recreation request included \$30,000 for a new batting cage at Stephens Park. That request is included in the State Capital Improvement Account. (p. 85)
- In addition, the State Improvement Account includes \$15,000 requested by the Fire Department for additional improvements to Station One.
- One of the most apparent changes is to Recycling. The proposed budget includes funding for the new Sustainability Coordinator and Equipment Operator positions at the Center. (pp. 57-58)
- The Fire Department budget includes an additional \$5,000 for support of Rescue 1. (pp.32-33) They also requested \$12,000 for a new Gator which is included in the Regions Reserve. (p.92)
- The Regions Capital Reserve continues to provide funding for the Police Cars and Fire Trucks, as well as \$25,000 for Comp Plan, \$7,000 for Main Street Banners, and \$3,000 for Arbor Board replanting.

With all of this, we project a positive ending, unallocated balance of \$2,261 in the General Fund.
