## Call to Order and Approval of Minutes

Co-President Sarah Hogan called the meeting to order via videoconferencing, due to the Covid pandemic, at 8:02 a.m.

Mayor Rusty Nix and Council member Leila Mitchell were welcomed.

Minutes of the February 11, 2021 meeting were reviewed. On a motion by Jones, seconded by Honeycutt, the minutes were approved as presented.

#### Treasurer's Report

Committee Chair, S. Hendren, presented a report dated March 10, 2021 indicating:

- Income Statement (Profit & Loss for 3/10/21): \$1,818 (up 12% from this time last year), \$650 in outstanding checks
- Balance Sheet (as of 3/10/21): \$57,199
- Net Statement Balance (as of 3/10/21) \$56,549 up \$1,500
- Membership Dues: \$1,518
- Veterans' Banners: one banner sold for \$300 and \$500 donated to American Village
- Miscellaneous: \$0Donations: \$0

On a motion by Garrity, seconded by McDonald, the financial reports were approved as presented.

#### President's Report

- Thanked Dee Woodham for her service as an ex-officio member of our board. Dee Woodham has resigned from the Montevallo Development Cooperative District and will no longer be on our board.

  - She will still be involved in the program.
- Main Street Training Updates

# Organization Committee – See President's Report

#### **Design Committee** – Kirk Lightfoot

- Inviting and recruiting new members on the committee (Deeleen Baker just joined)
- John McKinnon fixed the sculpture at the football field.
  - o Funding has been secured for repainting.
- Committee approved youth banner project.
  - Working on flyer/paperwork for schools admin and art teachers.
    - Art should be submitted by end of the school year.
- Julie Smitherman will now oversee façade grants.
- Working with Sustainable Montevallo for Earth Day event of some sort.
  - Thinking about a scavenger hunt.

#### **Promotion Committee** – Carolyn Garrity

- Committee members attended Calera's First Friday event, and there is interest in Montevallo to begin Second Saturday Events soon, possibly in collaboration with the Chamber.
- Friday Nights at the Cove will begin soon, with the first event being April 30.
- Handbills and posters have been distributed for the "Blooming Bargains" program conducted in partnership with the Chamber, and American Village's Festival of Tulips is now open.
- "Love Montevallo" photo spot will remain at Owl's Cove Park until the end of March.
- Work will be underway soon on an updated mural map.

#### **Economic Vitality Committee** – Ken Jones

- Big news is that people are feeling better in general because of the warmer spring weather, decreases in COVID results, and expanded access to vaccines is bringing greater optimism.
  - People want to get out and do things.
- Continuing projects:
  - Financial support of Art Fest in April, thinking about sponsoring a music act or something else

- Supporting Friday Nights at the Cove
- Promoting eco-tourism in Montevallo to take advantage of the great parks and resources we have available.
  - Talking about a Swamp tour, but University isn't allowing tours right now.
  - Encouraging everyone to get out and explore.
- Also looking to help perspective businesses trying to open. Committee wants to know what they can do to help them these businesses get open. Trying to make contact and see what their issues are, hoping to help them overcome obstacles.
  - For example, having a "Code Team" meeting with Shelby County.
- Many small businesses are still applying for PPP program.
- Mayor Nix:
  - Sales tax revenue is up this year versus last year. March is looking really strong in terms of sales tax (especially with Navarro's Fresh Market and two Dollar Generals opening)
  - Planning and Zoning Commission has a Work Session on 3/11/21 to address parking minimums, etc. The goal is to try to clean up some of the code requirements on parking and other issues.

#### Sustainability Committee - Olivia Barone

- Committee is meeting next week, the meeting was moved because of the training this week
- Free County Dump Day: March 27<sup>th</sup> (items can be taken to Recycling Center or landfill)
- The Recycling Center has received 40 tons of recyclables in first 2 months of 2021, compared to 60 tons is all of 2020.
  - o There is also a thrift store bin to make it easier to people to donate.
  - Electronics recycling: materials used to be accepted on the last Friday, but now they are accepted all the time.
    - Can't take big tube TV monitors
- 11<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Earth Day is April 22<sup>,</sup> 2021
  - o Committee is partnering with Impact Montevallo to plan a family friendly event.
