### Call to Order and Approval of Minutes

Co-President Sarah Hogan called the meeting to order, via videoconferencing due to the Covid pandemic, at 8:04 a.m. Councilor Mitchell was also welcomed.

Minutes of the March 11, 2020 meeting were reviewed. On a motion by K. Lightfoot, seconded by C. Nordan, the minutes were approved as presented.

## Treasurer's Report

In the absence of Treasurer S. Hendren, Co-President S. Hogan presented a report dated April 8, 2021 indicating:

- Income Statement (Profit & Loss for 4/6/21): -\$1,477
- Gross Statement Balance (as of 4/8/21): \$55,572
- Net Statement Balance (as of 4/6/21): \$54,922
- Membership Dues: \$1,115 collected this month (\$7,114 YTD)
- Work Plan Report:
  - The Organization Committee work plan "D&O Insurance" was completed this month. \$620 was budgeted, with the actual costs being \$612; this work plan was completed \$8 under budget.

On a motion by H. Lehman, seconded by K. Lightfoot, the financial reports were approved as presented.
