Call to Order and Approval of Minutes

In the absence of President Herman Lehman, Past President Julie Smitherman called the meeting to order at 8:06 a.m. A quorum was not present. Steve Gilbert and Lelia Mitchell were welcomed as guests.

Minutes were reviewed from the meeting on May 18, 2023. The minutes were unanimously approved as presented by an online vote after the meeting.

Past President Julie Smitherman reported:

Board Committee Reports

Organization Committee – In the absence of President Herman Lehman, Past President Julie Smitherman reminded the board that we celebrate 7 years as a Designated Main Street Community this month. In addition, we congratulate Centreville and Russellville for being newly designated this month.

Design Committee – Committee Chair, Kirk Lightfoot, reported that a new disc for the post office photo frame will be ordered for Christmas that matches our banners; volunteers are requested to water plants at the Post Office; Shining Star t-shirts are still available for \$25 each from Courtney; 8 new veteran banners will be installed in time for Independence Day; 30 veteran banners will retire in August and the purchasers have been notified by email, with follow-up calls to happen soon; the committee is formulating a plan to purchase new Christmas bows for the downtown street poles, with \$15,000+ needed for this expense; the Shining Star dedication on May 26 was well-received with 40 people in the audience; a plan to replace dead and missing streetscape trees will be formulated soon; one Facade Grant application was submitted by La Conchita.

Promotion Committee – Committee Chair, Carolyn Garrity, reported that the committee did not meet this month, but Friday Nights at the Cove in May went well with close to 200 audience members; all are invited to the next Friday Nights at the Cove on June 30, featuring DRUM the Program and sponsored by Alabama Public Television; supplies for up to 100 participants are being purchased for the UM Orientation Weekend craft activity planned for August 19 at Parnell Library.
